enjoy one another.



- ♦ Easy “word searches” for young children

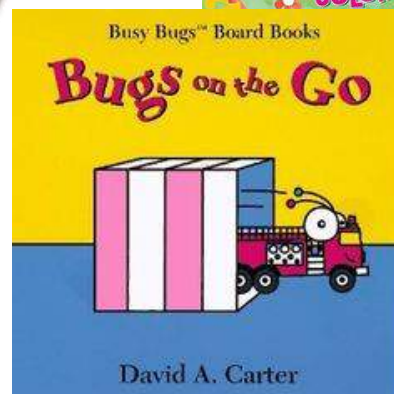
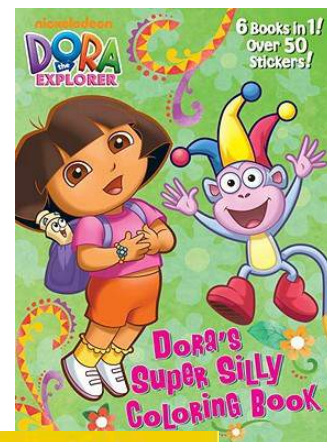

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The theme of the Stewardship Season this year is “A New Heart.” It comes from the Bible verse, “A new heart I will give you, and a new spirit I will put within you; and I will remove from your body the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh” (Ezekiel 36:26, NSRV).

We began in September with two Adult Forums: Financial Management on September 18th and Financial Autobiography on September 25th. The October 2nd Forum will be an introduction to Online Giving, as well as to provide a Finance Update. Stewardship talks happen the first four Sundays in October, with a focus on why we give out of our abundance of time, talent, and financial resources.

Is giving a need that comes from our heart of flesh? Commitment Sunday will be observed on Sunday, November 6th with a Coming Together Service, followed by a potluck brunch and celebration.

We associate Stewardship with our financial support of the church. One of the coolest parts of my job is creating images for special events and seasons, like Stewardship.

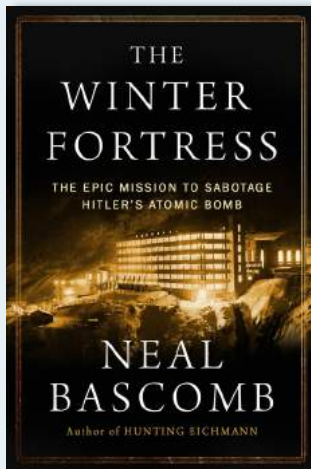
For Stewardship, I spend a lot of time pondering what the logo should look like. After all, it will be featured on items we use all year, like the Ministry Directory.

### What's noteworthy?

- ♦ At the end of August, we were operating at essentially break-even, with a slight deficit of \$621. (Figures through the end of September were not available at the time the *Caller* went to press.)
- ♦ Lower than normal giving in August eliminated the previous month-end surplus of \$6,489. Consistent giving by all helps avoid these extreme month-to-month income deviations. If you were away during the summer and your giving fell behind what you intended, consider what you can do to make things “whole” again. We will need a surplus going into the final months of 2016 to meet certain large end-of-year expenses (primarily our insurance payment, which we pay in December).
- ♦ Please note that the mortgage payment goes up by \$300/month in September.
- ♦ Thank you for your generous support to Calvary!



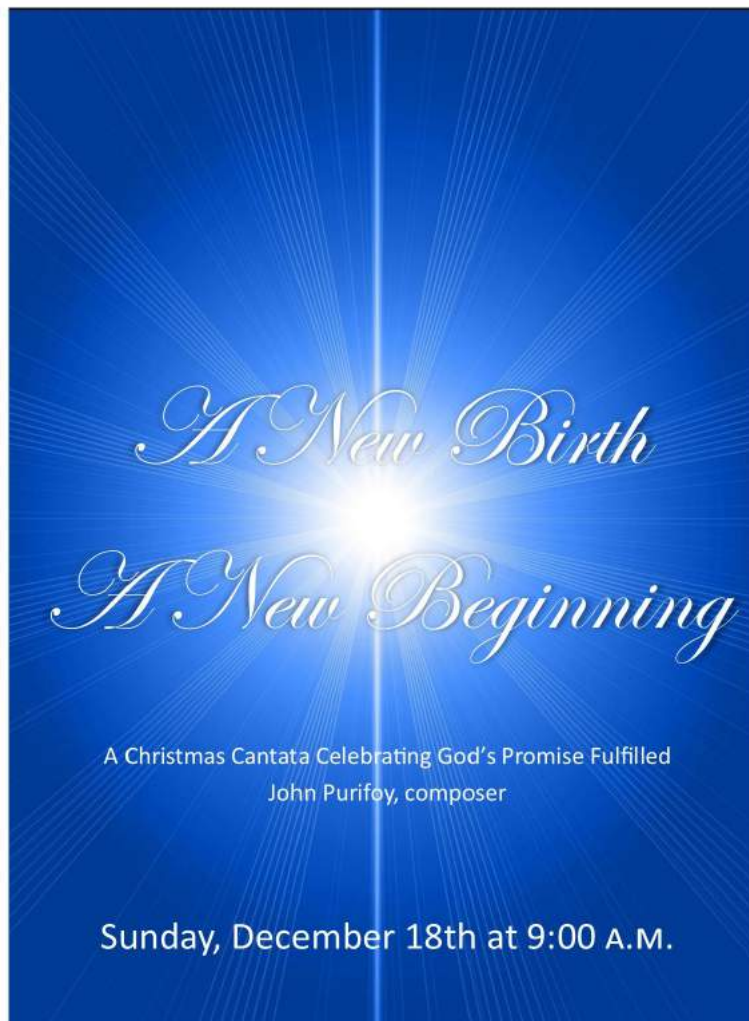
