# The Caller



## Immersed

*So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus. Romans 6:11*

I have always wished that I could serve a congregation that has a full-immersion baptismal font in the entrance of the church. You know, like a full on, up-to-your-waist font, with a fountain that gurgles, built with elegant stone that says “this is a really significant and symbolic piece of furniture in this sanctuary—pay attention.” A font that is unavoidable, and that you actually have to notice before you enter the rest of the worship space. A baptistery that says, “Do not pass go, do not collect \$200.” Or maybe, better, “This is the way in (to life in Christ).”



I want a full-immersion baptismal font, not because I think that immersion is necessary or even superior to sprinkling. No, it's the symbolism that intrigues me.

In the early church, baptismal fonts were always built as pools. Whether the font was in the shape of a circle, square, or a cross, whether it was raised or dug into the ground, the candidate stood at

## From Pastor Lori, continued...

least waist-deep in the water with the pastor and was plunged into the water “in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.” The baptismal candidate descended down into the basin from the entrance to the sanctuary, meeting the baptizer in the deepest part of the water, then only after baptism stepped out of the water, into the sanctuary—symbolizing his or her entrance into the community of faith.

During this season of Lent you will find our modest baptismal fonts poised at the opening to our worship spaces. They are there to catch your attention, and make you stop and wonder.



Each week the fonts will be filled with symbols for the Gospel stories. Sand for wilderness. Branches and eggs for God gathering us in. Horseshoe nails and blossoms for suffering and hope. Why those symbols in the font? Because it is

through the font that we enter into faith, that we enter into our daily life.

By the time you read these words, we will be three-fifths of the way through the Sundays of Lent. We have been privileged to hear from Sandy and Keith Klungness, Bobbi McClain, and Dwight Otto; in the next two weeks we will hear from Mike Ragan and Janet Freeman-Daily. By the time we reach Holy Week, each of these people will have told us about what their baptism means for their daily life—how they see God at work moving with them and inspiring them to be present and active in the world.

At Sunday Forum, we are having a conversation between the Gospel passages for Sundays and our own lives. We are practicing recognizing how our life of faith calls us to die to sin and be made alive in Christ. As Luther says in the *Small Catechism*: “[Baptism] signifies that the old person in us ... is to be drowned and die

through daily sorrow for sin and through repentance, and on the other hand that daily a new person is to ... rise up to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.” Consider joining the conversation.

On Wednesday nights during Vespers we are doing a prayer practice called *the Examen*, considering how we have experienced God in the past week, and how we might seek God’s guidance in the next week. In prayer and in worship we are practicing dying and rising in Christ.

Finally, all of our attention to baptism brings us to the Easter Vigil and the celebration of the resurrection. In the early church Lent was a time when candidates for baptism entered into an intensive period of preparation before Easter. That preparation culminated at the Vigil, where the candidate promised to live among God’s faithful people, hear God’s word and share in the Lord’s supper, follow Christ’s example in word and deed, and seek justice and peace, in the world. We will affirm the same commitments at our Easter Vigil—and in those commitments we will experience dying and rising.

May God who takes us on this blessed journey, give us confidence that we will rise in Christ to the joy of Easter.

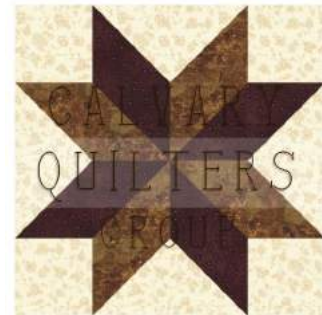

## Community Supper: Volunteer View

I was washing dishes for the Community Supper on Thursday night, January 28th. We were all ready to leave when I was told there was a young man sitting at a table asleep and wouldn't leave. I tried every way I could think of to awaken him and get him moving but he would stiffen up and was unresponsive otherwise. I told him I did not want to call the police and would he please get up as it was time to leave. I had one of the dishwashers call 911 and they sent out the paramedics. None of our regular guests knew who he was. The paramedics couldn't get him to awaken either, but managed to take his vital signs. They said he was okay and "lucid" otherwise. He stiffened up when they tried to move him and they told him they would have to take him to the hospital if he didn't get up now. They called the police for assistance. Two police officers came and assessed the situation. They tried to rouse him but he just stiffened again. The paramedics brought in a gurney to take him to the hospital. The policemen then moved the chairs out of the way and pulled the table out quickly. The young man came to his feet hunched over. As they were preparing to put handcuffs on him, he mumbled. One of the policemen told the other to stand away and let the man stand up and turn around. Then the most astonishing thing happened. The policeman began to sign to the young man who instantly signed in return. He was deaf! He immediately understood he had to leave. The policeman had a gift and he recognized the situation and used his skill to deescalate everything instantly. I was impressed by the professional handling of the situation by the paramedics and police officers, and especially the police officer who had taken the extra effort to learn signing.

Because the young man had slept through his dinner...I ran into the back room and grabbed a sack lunch and handed it to him as he was leaving.

Too often in life, we believe we understand a situation and make assumptions accordingly. We are too quick to judge, as one of the guests commented that the young man must have been on drugs. This young man's look of appreciation when I handed him the sack lunch haunts me. We who help at the Community Supper and the Sack Lunch Program have some appreciation of what these folks' situations are, but this young man's life on the street's I can't imagine. I pray for him.

## Internship Update

In December 2014, Calvary's members took a vote in which we decided to become an Internship Site. We determined it would be wise for us to be a site for more than one year, so that we could learn the process and determine if it was a good both minister to interns and complement our staff. In 2016—perhaps after Carrie's departure and before the next intern arrives—it will be important for the Church Council and then the congregation to re-evaluate that process and our commitment to it.

Carrie still has 6 months of her internship remaining, but some of you have been asking what happens after she concludes her term with us.

In late August 2016, we will receive our next intern. Luther Seminary, our partner seminary in the internship process, has asked us to consider a geographically restricted intern. "Geographically restricted" means that the candidate is currently in an alternate track to ordination—either doing distance learning directly through Luther or studying at another seminary while fulfilling requirements for Lutheran ministry.

I have met with the candidate and his wife and we agreed, and then informed the seminary, that we could easily work together as Supervisor and Intern. Since then, we have re-applied to be an Internship Site, and this candidate has been identified as the future intern for this site.

In future months, I will happily give more details about our next intern. But for now, we should continue to give our attention to completing this first internship well. Please give Carrie, me, and the Internship Site Team feedback about what is going well, what needs Carrie's, my, or the Team's attention, and participate in the ministries (especially worship and Bible study) that will help you to give accurate, honest, and necessary input in the process.
