Our Red Wagon Mission for April is the <u>Federal Way Community Gardens!</u> As spring is here, so is the time for planting. We will specifically donate to the Truman Garden, located at Truman Academy, 31455 28th Ave. S., Federal Way, WA 98003.

In 2016, Federal Way Community Gardens will deliver fresh produce weekly to SHAG apartments and to local churches hosting community suppers. (Calvary has long been involved in the Federal Way Caregiving Network's weekly Community Supper program.)


Garden needs include:

- Potting Soil (Miracle Grow bags at Costco are perfect) 10 needed
- Organic Slug Bait (Sluggo, etc.) 6 large containers needed
- Organic Fertilizer (Dr. Earth, general vegetable type) lots needed!
- ♦ 32-gallon Trash Bags—50 bags needed

If you find that these large items are too heavy and awkward to transport, smaller sizes are perfectly acceptable. Monetary donations will be forwarded to FW Community Gardens to go toward items still needed.





Tuesday Bible Study







Care Connection has
