


On May 14th, FLY gathered for an end-of-season game of live action Hungry Hungry Hippo.

Prediabetes Class Begins in June



The King County YMCA will be hosting a new Diabetes Prevention Program at Calvary beginning June 15, 2016. The year-long group will meet every Wednesday from 5:00-7:00 p.m. for sixteen weeks, then monthly for the following 8 months.

What's noteworthy?


April Current and Benevolence income was \$7,421.96 lower than expenses. As a result, the year-to-date deficit rose to \$11,215.93.

As the tables above reflect, we faced a similar deficit at this time in 2015.

Even though the deficit is somewhat lower than at this time last year, future trends bear watching. Through April 2016, Current and Benevolence giving constituted 28.1 percent of the projected total for the year. At the same point in 2015, Current and Benevolence giving was 32.6 percent of the amount contributed for the year. This means that at the end of April, we were actually behind last year in meeting eventual expenditures by year's end.

If you are planning to be gone this summer, consider developing a plan to keep your giving up to date while you are gone. Many are faithful in restarting their giving when they return, but by keeping giving consistently up to date, we help avoid the month-to-month deviations in church income that add to the stress of managing congregational affairs. Thanks for your generous support to Calvary!
