#### FROM YOUR COUNCIL PRESIDENT KYLE FRANKLIN

Some of my greatest memories at Pacific Lutheran University are of Tuesday nights in Tower Chapel, singing and praying through Holden Evening Prayer. The chapel was illuminated only by candles and the flickering of the light somehow added to the contemplative nature of worship. The depth of darkness and the importance of the light were always amplified in the winter. "Keep watch within me, God; deep in my heart may the spirit of love be Center to meet with seven burning bright."

Holden Evening Prayer was especially important to me during Advent. Beyond the presence of darkness and light, the fact that we sang about Mary and the Annunciation helped to reinforce an air of expectation that otherwise felt absent for me. I was raised in a tradition that focused on Jesus coming to save Now to him who by the powthe world. But, in the liturgical church, the season of Advent expresses a yearning and longing for Jesus to come and change the world!

We have all heard the stories of the poor Jewish boy who was born in a stable and laid in a manger. We have heard about the visit of the Magi and the shepherds. We have heard about the exile in Egypt. We have also heard

about Jesus teaching in the Temple and performing miracles and dining with people who were way below him in social status. We have heard the stories—but how often do we reflect on the way that Jesus truly *changed* the world?

The weekend prior to Thanksgiving, a small group from Calvary (Pastor Lori, Intern Pastor Megan, Bobbi McClane, Dave Fernandez, and myself) traveled to Seabrook Conference other congregations, Bishop Jaech, and the Synod Revitalization Team. We are participating in a program called Imagine that is intended to equip us to grow and become even more integral to Federal Way, both to those who already benefit from our ministries and to the greater community. Our guiding scripture:

er at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, for ever and ever. Ephesians 3:20-21

Over the next two years, this small team will regularly meet and study scripture. We will pray for each other, for the congregation, for Calvary, and for the greater Federal Way

community. And, in all reality, we will encourage you to love the Calvary that is and has been while challenging you to embrace the Calvary that could be. We know that change is sometimes uncomfortable, but we also know that the birth of Jesus changed the world! And, in Jesus' name, we have the power to change the world, too!

As a first step, I ask you to pray. Pray for the Imagine team. Pray for Calvary and its ministries. And for yourself and your heart as a vital part of who and what Calvary is and could be.

May this season of waiting for Immanuel be filled with expectation and yearning for a world changed.

#### **UPDATE** Reach Out – Help Needed

Reach Out shelters —for both men and women opened on October 1 and will run through March 31. We are anticipating that both shelters will be running at capacity. The Women's Shelter will be at Good Shepherd Episcopal Church all 6 months while the men's shelter will be hosted by St. Columba's (October & March), New Community (November), St. Vincent's (December) and here at Calvary (January & February). The program is run by donations and grants which pay for the staffing provided by Catholic Community Services and supplies. The balance of items needed are provided by volunteers (meals and host sites and things like socks).

The men will move to Calvary on Tuesday, December 26 and leave on Monday, February 26, 2018. When we are hosting the men Calvary needs to provide:

#### Need: host for each night – sign up for once a week or just part of the 9 weeks

1. a host each evening who will be responsible to let in the site manager provided by Catholic Community Services and the meal teams. Then help the meal teams set up their meal service.

2. meals for one week at Calvary – January 8-14, 2018 - a hot dinner for 25 hungry men (main dish, vegetable, salad, bread, dessert)

Need: 7 meals teams (4-5 each) <u>plus</u> one person to coordinate the week Need: shopper to purchase items needed for our week of meals


With our current health issues, Jim & I will not be able to be as involved as in past years so we really need your help. Signup sheets are up now.

#### What's noteworthy?

- In October, income exceeded expenses \$2,161, increasing the amount of surplus year to date (YTD) to \$19,506. In 2016, note that there was still a year to date deficit at the end of October.
- Income YTD at the end of October is higher than it was in 2016. Expenses YTD are lower than in 2016, partly due to building expense accounts being offset by building use fees.
- Thanks to all for your continued generous and faithful giving!

**End-of-year contributions:** If you want your contributions to be included in your official year-end tax statement from the congregation, please submit them no later than **Sunday, December 31st.** 

**Still seeking your pledges:** Our stewardship drive ended in November, but if you forgot or were away, you can still submit your pledge. Pledging gives your congregational leaders important information for developing a responsible budget. Pledges can be mailed to the church office, or you can drop them by during office hours. Handling of all pledge information remains confidential no matter when the pledge is submitted.
