Silent No More

33 When it was noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. 34 At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, Iema sabachthani?" which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" -Mark 15:33-34

Ben and I just returned from a four-day conference in St. Louis entitled, "When God Is Silent." We meditated on the words of Jesus in his suffering, heard from scholars and pastors who asked us to consider the real, often palpable, silence in which people exist in life, and were invited to offer those we minister to real consolation in the crucified and risen Christ.

During these days we heard the heart-crushing story of young parents caring for their newborn daughter whose eight weeks outside the womb were lived in constant pain—weeks in which her parents could not hold her for fear that it would only magnify her pain. We heard about members of our communities and church who feel pushed to the margins of life because they bear the wounds that come with being gay, or drug addicted, or mentally ill. We considered how the church (especially through ritual and sacraments) can provide a new way for our wounded world to encounter the living Christ. And we listened to the teachings

of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, bidding us to love the world better than it loves itself.

CALVARY'S WELCOME STATEMENT

As Christ's church we choose to be different together, embracing the diversity of God's creation. We celebrate the beauty of this creation by welcoming people of all:

- Beliefs, questions, doubts
- Races, cultures, and ethnicities
- Sexual orientations, gender identities and expressions
- Economic status and living situations
- Physical and mental abilities and challenges
- Ages and appearances
- Marital status and family situation

Our Welcoming Team is inviting every member of our congregation to live into and embody this welcome in February and March by attending a Speaker Series we have entitled "Silent No More: Sex, Gender & Identity in the Church." This series is intended to give voice to the voiceless, and encourage us as people who (in Bonhoeffer's words) "love the world better than the world loves itself."

But the "Silent No More" Speaker Series is not just for us. We urge you to invite family, friends, neighbors, community members, and fellow Christians to be part of this conversation. The series will take place on three consecutive Sundays: February 17, 24, and March 3—all at 3pm.

One of the most important things we Christians

need to do in the 21st century to meet the community and the world in a Christ-like way is to listen to those on the margins. We do this, not because we are bleeding hearts, but because Christ sought out and loved those on the margins, and consequently found himself on the margins, and ultimately on the cross couched between two criminals. Jesus chose to be where people were hurt and alienated, so we as the Church go to those places too. But in order to do that we begin by listening to those who have been wounded and alienated by the Church.

In this series you will hear from a Southern Baptist pastor who led his conservative congregation into practicing welcome for gay and lesbian people. You will hear a scholar recall the atrocities Hitler's state church committed against minorities—especially men who were suspected of being gay.
And you will hear from yet another scholar about how the conservative church, in its desire to prevent premarital sex among its members, created an oppressive purity culture that has damaged young adults in their ability to experience healthy, intimate relationships as adults.

Empathy can only become a habit for us Christians if we first stop to listen to the cries of those who feel abandoned by the Church. Jesus own words of abandonment remind us not only that such abandonment is a real human experience; it also calls us to pay attention to those who experience that same kind of alienation in our time—because they too are loved by Christ.


Please join our Welcoming Team in making Calvary an empathetic and responsive church by attending these speaking engagements this month and in March. Your act of listening is an important act of faith.

Worship Leaders—Every Day People Making Us Possible

Each month between 84 & 105 of our every-day members serve as worship leaders in our services.

In a month with Holy Week we assign about 180 worship leaders. You may see the same folks always leading, and there are some others who work behind the scene who are as dedicated in their leadership.

Would you like to take your turn in leadership? Do you see a place where you could serve once a month or once a quarter?

Here is how it works:

- We give you detailed instructions and walk-thru training.
- You have total control of when you serve. Each month you receive an email asking your availability for the following month.
- The schedule is available the last week of the prior month, in The Caller, on our website and emailed to all who are scheduled.
- If you are scheduled to serve and find

you are unavailable, it is your responsibility to trade with another leader. Our office staff does not make the schedules.

- If you try one of the leadership positions and it doesn't work for you just let us know.
- We especially need leaders serving as Building Supervisor- the designated person who unlocks the building, turns on the heat and lights and generally keeps a keen eye on any unusual activity during our services.
- We are ready to train some folks on our Sound Board. Our lead will be unavailable for nearly a month during a busy time this spring. Some of our Sound Board operators are also in choir, so we really need you! You might want to only step in when the need is great, that works.

Thanks to all who serve faithfully at each service. Please speak to a pastor or to Marj Hause if you would like to explore your turn in a leadership role.
