Engaging Lent

The season of Lent is upon us. It's the season of turning inward and turning towards God. For many it is a season of fasting – for going without something we regularly use.

The days leading up to Ash Wednesday are filled with people deciding what to “give up” for Lent. Our social media feeds have become a convenient and public venue for sharing what we are “giving up.”

One of the popular things I see people “giving up” for Lent these days is social media. Facebook was created in 2004 as a way to connect with people attending the same college. In 2004, no one considered “giving up” social media for Lent! Sixteen years later, the world is a different place and social media is an inescapable part of our lives (if you've avoided it in your life, major kudos!).

When people decide to “give up” social media, they usually do so with a post containing a witty meme such as “BRB in 40 days. Gone for Lent” or “Gone for Lent, See you at Easter.” These memes are generally posted right after their post for Ash Wednesday: “Get your Ash in Church!”



I've never given up social media for Lent (it's hard to do when you manage business social me-

dia accounts). Over the years, most of my Lenten practices have involved food: twice in college I was a vegan during Lent (perhaps not the healthiest choice for a college student) and a few times I even gave up alcohol for Lent.

Continued from Intern Pastor Melissa...

What I appreciate about the different fasting options people choose for Lent, is the way they prompt conversational engagement — an opportunity to speak about our faith and its importance in our lives!

For example, your friends are talking about a photo they saw on Facebook or Instagram. When they ask you about your opinion, instead of shrugging it off and saying you didn't see the post, you recognize their question as an invitation! Not only did you not see the photo but the reason *why* you didn't see the photo, is a significant part of your life! You take the invitation and an opportunity for transformation emerges.

The times when I gave up alcohol during Lent occurred when I was in my mid-20's. Ted enjoyed these Lenten fasts as he had a built in designated driver. When out with friends, they would ask me why I wasn't drinking: (friend) "You sure you don't want one?" (me) "Yes, I'm sure." (friend) "Are you pregnant?" (me) "No, I gave up alcohol for Lent." (friend) "Huh?" Humorous, yes? But did you see the invitation? My friends certainly thought it

was weird that I was abstaining from alcohol when I wasn't pregnant but they hadn't heard of the season of Lent. This was my invitation to share about my faith and its importance in my life.

Many of these friends have had negative experiences with the institutional church or with Christians. Many have witnessed the harm done to their loved ones in the name of Jesus. These moments where an invitation for me to share my faith and say that the God I have experienced, loves everyone and does not discriminate in the way that humans do. And I am able to commiserate that the institutional church is a broken human institution (hello, *human!*).

Fasting by "giving up" something is not the only option for Lent. There are many ways to practice Lent that can lead to the invitation to share why you are doing things differently in Lent.

Our Gospel reading for Ash Wednesday talked about giving alms and prayer as two other options.

Giving alms. How do you give a little more during this season than you normally give? Giving alms is not just about the offering plate (although that is a good thing too). Calvary is par-

ticipating in Lutheran World Relief's Season of Hope. Help others with personal care by donating personal care items each week. We will assemble the kits on Palm Sunday.

Prayer. Add intention to your prayer life during Lent. Join us on Wednesdays at 7pm for a time of contemplative song and prayer. Grab a "Lent in a Bag" kit in the Narthex. The kits include prompts for engaging aspects of Lent at home. You can use the kit individually or use it together as a family.

There are many other options for wandering through the Lenten wilderness. Be creative! Strive to exercise for 30 minutes a day. Engage a practice of gratitude. Buy a coffee for the person behind you in line every time you go to Starbucks.

Whatever you do or do not do during this Lenten season, do it with intention. Pay attention. Invitations abound for you to share with others the reason why you are doing things differently.

Let us journey together this season,

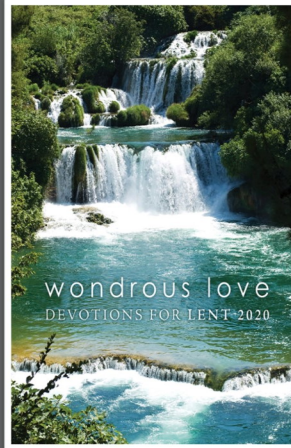

Dear Members of Calvary Lutheran Church,

Thank you for your generous support for the ministry of the Southwestern Washington Synod. The word "Synod" means walking the same path together. As all 88 congregations in our Synod join together in prayer, spirit and financial resources, we are able to accomplish so much more than any one of us could on our own. During the fiscal year ending January 31, 2020, the total mission support from all of you in our Synod totaled \$1,084,938, which was \$8,000 more than we had budgeted! Thank you for your key help with this.

Here are some of the ministries that we have accomplished together this past year. With your help, we have expanded our prison ministry. Along with the Living Stones congregation at the Men's Correction Center in Shelton, we have strengthened our Empowering Life ministry at the Women's Correction Center in Purdy. We are also teaming with the Northwest Washington Synod to start a ministry at the state prison in Monroe, north of Seattle.

We now have two cohorts of students, numbering 27 in total, who are enrolled in our PSALM program for training lay ministers. In our *Imagine* program for re-vitalizing congregations, a third cohort of congregations has begun their participation.

During this past year, we ordained two pastors and two deacons from our Synod, who were supported throughout their academic and spiritual formation work by our Synod's Candidacy Committee. Three are serving in our Synod and one is pastoring a church in Alaska.

Forty percent of your mission support offering to the Synod is passed on to the national ELCA, which in turn supports seminaries, youth programs and missionary outreach throughout our nation and the world.

Enclosed you will find the statement for your congregation's mission support from February 1, 2019, to January 31, 2020. Please contact us if you have any questions or corrections to make.

Thank you for giving witness to a loving God in all that you do. It is a privilege and honor to be walking this path with you!
